I am pleased to write this letter on behalf of Bert Ongkeo who served as a project coordinator for a course that I co-direct at the New York University School of Medicine. This course, called Interclerkship Intensives (ICI), occurs for 2 weeks per year during medical students' first year of clinical rotations. The ICI course consists of small group workshops, lectures, and simulation activities with standardized patients (actors) and mannequins. We provide it for approximately 170 students and involves dozens of faculty, staff, and actors. Thus, it is very complicated to plan and coordinate. Bert is an extremely hard worker, and was dedicated to making sure that each session ran smoothly. He is also visually creative. He put together a beautiful ICI logo, and the documents he creates look very professional.
